Mountain Custom Quilting

Jelly for Jelly Rolls

Finished size 51.5" x 61.5"

Fabric Requirements:

One Jelly roll of pre cut

2.5" wide strips

Green Fabric

.5 m sashing, stones,

and first border

Cream Fabric

4-4.5" squares, corner stones

Blue fabric

0.6 m for outer border

*Note: cut sizes are enlarged for pieced blocks to enable trimming accuracy.

WOF = width of fabric

HST = half square triangle


RST = right sides together

1/4" seam allowance and 42" WOF


Let's get started...

block 1

Key Block (31/100 actual size)







Organize jelly roll strips in colours, remove lights for now, set aside for sashings.

Block 1

Using 5 - 2.5" strips WOF, cut 30 - 2.5" x 4.5" pieces = 'C'

Using 5 - 2.5" strips WOF, cut 30 - 2.5" x 6.5" pieces = 'B'

Use remainder of fabric used for 'C and B' pieces to make 10 - 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. = 'A'

Sewing instructions:

NOTE: Be mindful to keep blocks similar in colour and like a log cabin. I used similar colours on one side and similar colours on opposite side.

Sew 2 'C' pieces together make 10 units. Press down.

Sew remaining 'C' pieces to the pair of 'C' pieces just sewn. Press down. Makes a 3 in row strata. Repeat this step for all 10 blocks.

Sew a 'B' piece to left side of the 'C' Strata, press to "B. Repeat step for all 10 blocks.

Sew another 'B' strip to the bottom of the block. Press down. Repeat this step for all 10 blocks.

Sew 'B' strip to 'A'- 2 ½" square of same fabric used in C strata. Be mindful to match top square with top 'C' piece. Repeat this step for all 10 blocks.

Make 10 blocks



Block 2

Using 4 strips WOF (2 colours). Sew two together and make a strata. Repeat to make 2 identical stratas, or similar depending on jelly roll contents. You need 20 pairs. Sew together 2 pairs to make 'C' repeat step and make 10 - 4 patch blocks.

Use 2 strips WOF and cut into 2 ½" x 4 ½" pieces, cut 5 of each = 'B'

Sub-cut same 2 strips into 2 ½" x 2 ½" squares cut 5 of each = 'C' (corners)

Use 2 strips WOF and cut into 2 ½" x 6 ½" pieces, cut 5 each = 'A'

Sewing instructions:

NOTE: Be mindful to keep blocks similar in colour. Like a log cabin I used similar colours on one side and similar colours on opposite side.

Sew 'B' piece to one side of 4 patch and another 'B' piece to other side of same 4 patch. Press towards 'B'. Repeat this step make 10 rectangle blocks.

Sew 'C' 2 ½ "square to 'A' piece 2 ½" x 6 ½". Press towards 'A'. Repeat this step to make 10 strips. Sew this strip to top and then to the bottom of the rectangle pieced blocks. Use reference block picture for placement and be mindful to turn your C block to be in opposite corners of each block. Repeat this step for 10 blocks.


NOTE: I made 2 colorways of block 2, 5 of each using up my jelly roll strips.



Cutting Diagrams


Patch Count







2 patches








1 patch

Sashing and stones:

Use cream or light fabrics from the jelly roll. Cut $31 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

Use green jelly roll strips and cut $62 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $2 \frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Draw diagonal line of back of each square.

Cut a 2 ½" strip WOF from Green fabric. Sub-cut into 12 -2 ½" x 2 ½" squares.

Sewing instructions:

Sew 2 of 62 jelly roll 2 ½" squares on one 8 ½" strip. Place each 2 ½" square so the diagonal line goes left to right of the strip

Trim inside HST out and leave remaining cream strip for sewing accuracy.

Press to strip. Repeat this step for all 31 sashing strips.

Quilt top construction:

Place block 1 then a sashing, then block 2, then another sashing, block 1 and a sashing, and another block 2.

Create rows alternating the blocks in between the sashings. Next row is a sashing and a stone, a sashing and a stone, etc.

I use a design wall to lay out my blocks and sashing and stones.

Sew the body of the quilt in rows, alternating pressing directions with each row to enable nesting of seams.

Row 1 - Sew a block 1 to a sashing strip and then a block 2 and a sashing strip etc.

Row 2 - Sew a sashing to a corner stone and another sashing etc. for the next row

Repeat for next 3 rows. Quilt body should measure $38 \% \times 48 \%$ ". If not measure and cut borders to fit your quilt body.

Measure quilt size before you cut borders.

Inner border - Using green fabric, cut 5 strips 2 1/2" WOF. Sew end for end and sub-cut into 2 - $48 \ 1/2$ " x 2 1/2" sides and 2 - $19 \ 3/8$ " x 2 1/2" top and bottom. Using leftover cream jelly roll strip, cut $4 - 2 \ \frac{1}{2}$ " squares for corner stones.

Sew sides strips to the main body of the quilt press towards strip. Repeat for both sides. Then sew 2 cream 2 ½" corner stone blocks to the top and bottom borders press towards cornerstone.

Sew top and bottom border strips to body of quilt, lining up corner stone edges.

Second border – Using blue fabric, cut 5 strips 4 1/2" WOF. Sew end for end and sub-cut 2 – 52 1/2" x 4 1/2" for sides and 2- 42 1/2" x 4 1/2" for top and bottom.

Cut $4-4\,\%$ " squares from cream scrap fabric. Using $16-2\,\%$ " squares (4 of each colour) draw a diagonal line and place square on each corner of the $4\,\%$ " square to make a square in a square, diamond block, corner stone. Trim away inside HST and press towards cream. Sew on opposite corners first and press. Then remaining 2 corner squares trim and press.

Sew on side borders to the quilt body and press out. Then as per first border sew on the corner stone to both ends of top and bottom border strips. Press in. Sew top and bottom borders to the quilt body.

Binding - Using fabric pieces from left over jelly roll or fabric of your choice, cut $5 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips WOF sew together and fold in half and sew to quilt edge after machine quilting.

Your Jelly is ready... enjoy.
