

Scrap Binding Kit

Variation of Goody Goody Binding Kit

Although I'd like to take all the credit for this binding kit. I give credit to Designer. My inspiration came from Vanessa Goertzen of Lella Boutique.

I have made some changes sew ... lets get started.

Fabric Requirements and Cutting info

Fabric requirements:

- 1 fat quarter for exterior and interior panel B
- 1 fat eighth interior panel A
- 1 fat quarter for binding/ exterior tie
- 1fat eighth zipper compartment fabric
- 1 polyester zipper (9 inch or longer)
- Scrap of wool or felt
- 10" square pocket fabric
- 10" square thread holder/ pocket binding fabric
- 6""x 8" square pocket flap (optional)
- 2" x 7" strip pocket binding
- 4' x 5" strip quilted for scissor pouch
- 10' of 1/4" 1/2" piece of elastic
- Scrap batting 12" x 24"
- 9' zipper
- Walking foot and zipper foot

Cutting instructions:

- A. Cut 1 Exterior panel,
- B. Cut 1 7" x 16.5" interior panel B 7" x 5.5"
- C. Cut 1 Interior panel A (lining)
- D. Cut 3 2.5" x 22" Binding strips
- E. Cut 1 1.75" x 20" strips for tie
- F. Cut 4 3.25" x 7" zipper pouch rectangles
- G. Cut 1 2.75" x 3" rectangle of wool
- H. Cut 1 5.5" x 8" rectangles for pocket, (Cut 2 3" x 8" pocket flap optional)
- I. Cut 1- 2" x 7" strip for pocket binding (optional)
- J. Cut 1 4" x 5" strip (quilted) scrap for binding optional
- K. Cut 1 10" piece of elastic for thread carrier



Machine quilt your exterior fabric and set aside

Have fun, quilt any way you desire.

Zipper pouch sew 2 pouch rectangles (WST) on the zipper tape (optional serge edge closest to zipper tape). Next repeat step for other 2 rectangle pieces on other side of zipper tape. Press away form zipper.





Top stitch along zipper tape and all the way around pocket. Stitch across zipper, make sure zipper pull tab is inside pocket area before you stitch across zipper.



Sew zipper pouch to the lining fabric.

Be mindful while stitching around your pocket to stay within the ¼ inch seam allowance of the binding. Set aside.



Right pocket pouch. With optional flap.

Fold pocket piece (H. in the cutting instructions)

You can trim this pocket top with a coordinating fabric, or top stitch it as I have.

With RST on optional flap pieces, sew a curve for bottom of the flap. Press and trim of corners. Invert and top stitch around edges and press flat. (again be mindful of your seam allowance so the flap isn't sewn into your binding seam.) I used a snap, but Velcro or a button would be other options for closure





Sew right pouch to interior panel B and stitch to zipper pouch and lining. Next measure your elastic piece. Pim ½ inch down from top (seam allowance) then measure 1.5 inch from that pin. Mark this spot with a pin but move this mark up to 1inch on ruler to create a hump in the elastic. Pin and sew in place. Which creates a thread holder. Repeat this step to the bottom of the elastic.




Scissor pouch I quilted this piece. Then added a trim fabric on the top edge. Sew and flip and press in raw edges on WSF. Then turn bottom edge in inch 1/4" and press.





Scissor pouch

Sew on right side with WSF facing up.
Press and flip and attach to the lining
with top stitching on the left side,
bottom and Right side leaving tip edge
open for scissor pouch.



Add needle patch of wool, above right pocket.



Sew tie to the RSF in the center. Bias tape maker I cut my strip 1.75" x 20" folded and top stitched.



Stitch binding all around and your done. Have fun with this project all kinds of options here are 2.
