

ABUNDANCE

96.5" X 96.5"

Sew this pattern using a scant ¼" seam allowance.

WOF = width of fabric, RST = right sides together, HST = half square triangle

Step 6: EIGHT HANDS AROUND. Make 12 blocks. 9 ½" x 9 ½" unfinished blocks.

This block uses Fabrics # 1, 4, 19 and 20.

Cutting instructions:

Fabric #1 Cut 2 - 3 1/8" strips WOF. Sub-cut into 24 - 3 1/8" x 3 1/8" squares.

Draw diagonal line =HST Label 'A1'.

Fabric #1 Cut 2 - 1 5/8" strip WOF. Sub-cut into 48- 1 5/8" x 1 5/8" squares.

Label 'C'.

Fabric #1 Cut 2- 5 3/4" strip WOF. Sub-cut into 12- 5 3/4" x 5 3/4" squares.

Label 'Lg FG'.


<u>Fabric #1</u> Cut 1 - 3 3/4" strip WOF. Sub-cut into 12 -3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " squares.

Label 'Sm FG'.

*NOTE: Use up scrap Fabric #1 from Lg FG, 5 %" strip. Trim remainder to 3 %" strip to make 2 more 3 %" x 3 %" squares for Sm FG.

Fabric #20 Cut 4 - 3 1/8" strip WOF. Sub-cut into 48 - 3 1/8" squares draw diagonal line. Label 'Lg FG A'.

Fabric #19 Cut 3 – 2 1/8" strip WOF. Sub-cut into 48 – 2 1/8" squares draw diagonal line. Label 'Sm FG E'.



Fabric #19 Cut 1 – 2 ¾" strip WOF. Sub-cut into 12 -2 ¾" x 2 ¾" squares Label 'F'.

Fabric #4 Cut 2 - 3 1/8" strips WOF. Sub-cut into 24 - 3 1/8" squares = HST Label 'A2'.

Block construction:

HST construction; Pair RST piece 'A1' with piece 'A2.

Sew ¼" seam on both sides of the diagonal. Cut on diagonal line,

press to the dark piece 'A2'. Make 48 HST. Trim to 2 3/4" x 2 3/4".







Flying Geese blocks: Sew Easy Quick pieced Flying geese unit method appendix attached.

Use this method to make all flying geese blocks.

Use 1 'Lg Fg' piece with 4 'FG A' pieces. Make 12 sets of 4 Flying geese. Trim to 2 ¾" x 5"

Use 1 'Sm FG' piece with 4 'Sm FG E' pieces. Make 12 sets of 4 Flying geese. Trim to 1 5/8" x 2 ¾".

Center star block:

Use 1-'F', and 4 - 'C' pieces, and 4 small flying geese.

Row 1



Press in direction of arrows.

Row 2









Chain stitch rows to maintain placement.

Row 3

Make 12 center star blocks trim to 5" x 5".

To create outer star use 4 HST, 4 Large flying geese and one center star block.

You have now completed Step 6.

How to Make a Quilt

Quick-Pieced Flying **Geese Units**


Try this method to make 4 perfect Flying Geese Units at the same time.

1. On wrong side of each small square, place Fons & Porter's Quarter Inch Seam Marker diagonally, with yellow center line positioned exactly at opposite corners. Mark stitching lines along both sides of the Quarter Inch Seam Marker.

NOTE: If you are not using Fons & Porter's Quarter Inch Seam Marker, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner across square. Then draw sewing lines on each side of the first line, 1/4" away.

SEW SMART" TIP

To cut squares for Flying Geese Units, determine desired finished size. Cut small squares %" larger than finished height of Flying Geese Unit; cut large square 11/4" larger than finished width. For example, for $3" \times 6"$ Flying Geese Units, cut small squares 3%" and large squares 71/4".



- 2. Place 2 matching small squares on 1 large square, right sides facing, as shown. Corners will overlap slightly. Stitch along both marked sewing lines (Photo A).
- Cut between rows of stitching. Press seams toward small triangles (Photo B).
- 4. Place 2 small squares on the units, as shown (Photo C).
- 5. Stitch on marked lines (Photo D).
- 6. Cut between rows of stitching and press (Photos E and F).
